for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania.

The Petition of Nathan Zukerman

A NATIVE OF Russia

Respectfully Sheweth:

That he declared on oath before the Justiciary of the Court of Common Pleas Philadelphia County on the 18 day of Novemb A. D. 1903 that it was *bona fide* his intention to become a citizen of the United States, and to renounce forever all allegiance and fidelity to any foreign prince, potentate, state or sovereignty, and particularly to the Czar of Russia of whom he was at that time a subject. That your petitioner has resided one year and upwards within the State of Pennsylvania, and within the United States of America five years and upwards immediately preceding this his application to become a citizen of the United States.

That he has never borne any hereditary title, or been of any orders of nobility in his own or any other country; that he does not disbelieve in, nor is he opposed to, all organized government; that he is not a member of, or affiliated with, any organization entertaining and teaching such disbelief or opposition; that he does not advocate, nor teach, the duty, necessity, or propriety of unlawfully assaulting or killing any specific individual or officers generally of the Government of the United States or of any other organized government, because of his or their official character, nor has he violated any of the provisions of an Act to regulate the immigration of aliens into the United States, approved March 3, 1903.

He therefore prays, that on making the proof, and taking the oath prescribed by law, he may be admitted to become a citizen of the United States of America.

And he will ever pray, &c.

Paul Lemanovitz a citizen of the United States of America, being duly sworn according to law, saith that he knows and is well acquainted with Nathan Zukerman the petitioner; that to his knowledge he has resided one year and upwards within the State of Pennsylvania, and within the United States of America five years and upwards immediately preceding his application to be a citizen; that during that time he has behaved as a man of good moral character, attached to the principles of the Constitution of the United States, and well disposed to the good order and happiness of the same; that, in so far as he knows, is informed, or believes, the applicant does not disbelieve in, nor is he opposed to, all organized government; nor is he a member of, or affiliated with, any organization entertaining and teaching such disbelief or opposition; nor does he advocate or teach the duty, necessity, or propriety of unlawfully assaulting or killing any specific individual or officers generally of the Government of the United States or of any other organized government, because of his or their official character; nor has he violated any of the provisions of an Act to regulate the immigration of aliens into the United States, approved March 3, 1903.
